ORDINANCE NO. 280

AN ORDINANCE FIXING ELECTRICAL RATES; AMENDING PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS SECTION 7.320; 7.445; 7.450; 7.460; 7.465; ADOPTING PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS SECTION 7.466 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

THE CITY OF DRAIN ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 7.320 of the City of Drain's Public Improvements Code is amended to read as follows:

7.320 Service Conductors Responsibility and Cost.

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(1) The customer shall install, own and maintain the service entrance and meter base for an over head conductor. The customer shall pay for, install, own and maintain the service entrance equipment. For an underground conductor the customer shall pay for, install, own and maintain a service lateral conduit. The city shall not be held liable for any loss or damage to persons or property resulting from defects in the customers installation or equipment or the delivery of energy thereto.

(2) The city shall install, own and maintain all equipment, other than those items enumerated in subsection (1) above, necessary to supply electricity to the meter and the meter itself. The cost of this service shall be paid by the person applying for the service at a rate of \$150 per meter.

Section 2. Sections 7.445; 7.450; 7.455; 7.460 and 7.465 of the City of Drain's Public Improvements Code are amended to read as follows; and section 7.466 is hereby adopted:

SCHEDULE A-3

7.445 Farm and Home Service.

Customers to whom this schedule applies shall pay the charges specified herein:

7.4451 Customers to Whom Schedule A-3 Applies.

Schedule A-3 shall apply to Farm and Home Consumers for all farm and home uses, including electric space heating, subject to extablished rules and regulations. The capacity of individual motors served under this schedule shall not exceed 10 H.P.

7.4452 <u>Type of Service Schedule A-3 Customers Shall Receive</u>: Single Phase 60 cycles, at available secondary voltage.

7.4453 <u>Monthly Rate</u>.

Basic Charge:\$5.00 (No KWH's included in basic charge)Energy Charge:All Kwh per month @ 1.7¢ per KWH

7.4454 <u>Minimum Charge</u>:

The minimum monthly charge shall be the basic charge where 15 KVA or less of transformer capacity is required. For consumers requiring more than 15 KVA of transformer capacity the minimum monthly charge shall be increased by 75¢ for each additional KVA or fraction thereof.

Where it is necessary to extend or re-enforce existing distribution facilities, the minimum monthly charge may be increased to assure adequate compensation for the added facilities.

7.4455 Minimum Annual Charge for Seasonal Service.

Consumers requiring service during a period not to exceed nine months per year shall pay a minimum annual payment of twelve times the minimum monthly charge determined in accordance with section 7.4453 and 7.4454.

7.4456 Application For Reduced Rates.

Any person who has applied for and been granted reduced water rates in accordance with section 7.085 of this code shall be entitled to reduced electric rates equal to the basic charge specified in section 7.4453 plus 1.7¢ per KWH per month for each KWH over and above 1700 KWH per month.

SCHEDULE B-3

7.450 General Lighting And Commercial Power Service.

Customers to whom this schedule applies shall pay the charges specified herein:

7.4501 Customers To Whom Schedule B-3 Applies.

Schedule B-3 shall apply to commercial, industrial three-phase consumers, restaurants, schools, churches, granges and community halls, for all uses including lighting, heating, and power, subject to the established rules and regulations covering this type of service.

7.4502 Type of Service.

Single-phase, and three-phase where available, at available secondary voltages. Motors having rated capacity in excess of ten horse power (10 H.P.) must be three-phase.

7.4503 Monthly Rate.

Basic Charge:	\$5.00 (No KWH's included in basic charge)
Energy Charge:	All KWH per month @ 1.7¢ per KWH

7.4504 <u>Demand Charge</u>.

First 15 kilowatts of billing demand per month, no demand charge. Excess above 15 kilowatts of billing demand per month at \$1.70 per kilowatt.

7.4505 Determination of Billing Demand.

The billing demand shall be the maximum average kilowatt load used by the consumer forany period of fifteen (15) consecutive minutes during the month for which the bill is rendered, as indicated or recorded by a demand meter.

7.4506 <u>Minimum Charge</u>.

The minimum monthly charge shall be the basic charge where 15 KVA or less of transformer capacity is required. For consumers requiring more than 15 KVA of transformer capacity the minimum monthly charge shall be increased by 75¢ for each additional KVA or fraction thereof.

Where it is necessary to extend or re-enforce existing distribution facilities, the minimum monthly charge may be increased to assure adequate compensation for the added facilities.

7.4507 Minimum Annual Charge for Seasonal Service.

Consumers requiring service during a period not to exceed nine months per year may guarantee a minimum annual payment of twelve times the minimum monthly charge determined in accordance with section 7.4503.

7.4508 <u>Temporary Service</u>.

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Temporary Service shall be supplied at the rates specified in setion 7.4503 and 7.4504 except that the consumer shall pay in addition to the foregoing charges the total cost of installing and connection of the service, as well as the dismantling charge, less the value of materials returned to stock. A deposit in advance may be required of the full amount of the estimated bill for service, including the cost of connection and disconnection.

SCHEDULE LP-3

7.451 Industrial Power Service.

Customers to whom this schedule applies shall pay the charges specified herein:

7.4511 Customers to Whom Schedule LP-3 Applies.

Schedule LP-3 shall apply to commercial, industrial and threephase consumers for all uses including lighting, heating and power, subject to the established rules and regulations covering this type of service.

7.4512 Type of Service.

Single-phase and three-phase where available, at available secondary voltages. Motors having a rated capactiy in excess of ten horse power (10 H.P.) must be three-phase.

7.4513 Rate.

Energy Charge: All KWH per month @ 0.9¢ per KWH

7.4514 Demand Charge.

Billing demand per month at \$1.70 per kilowatt.

7.4515 Determination of Billing Demand.

The billing demand shall be the maximum average kilowatt load used by the consumer for any period of fifteen (15) consecutive minutes during the month for which the bill is rendered, as indicatied orrecorded by a demand meter.

7.4516 Power Factor.

The consumer agrees to maintian unity power factor as nearly ad practicable. Power factor may be measured at any time. Should such measurements indicate that the power factor during the billing period is less than 90% the demand for filling purposes shall be the demand as indicated or recorded by the demand meter multiplied by 90% and divided by the percent power factor.

7.4517 Minimum Monthly Charge.

The minimum monthly charge under this rate shall be based on \$.75 for each KVA of installed trnasformer capacity or fraction thereof required.

Where it is necessary to extend or re-enforce existing distributing facilities, the minimum monthly chargemay be increased to assure adequate compensation for the added facilities.

7.4518 <u>Temporary Service</u>.

Temporary service shall be supplied in accordance with the charges in sections 7.4513 and 7.4514 except that the consumer shall pay in addition to the foregoing charges the total cost of connecting and disconnecting service less the value of materials returned to stock. A deposit, in advance may be required of the full amount of the estimated bill for service, including the cost of connection and disconnection.

Street and Highway Lighting Service. 7.455 Customer to whom this schedule applies shall pay the charges specified herein:

7.4551 Customers to Whom Schedule SL-3 Applies.

Schedule LS-3 shall apply to outdoor service for street lighting, highway lighting, roadway, and park lighting.

7.4552

<u>Character of Service</u>. Alternating current, either series or multiple system, or in combination, at option of utility.

7.4553 Rate.

Basic Charge:	\$5.00 (No KWH's	included	in basic	charge)
Energy Charge:	All KWH per mont	±h @ 1.1¢	per KWH	

SCHEDULE YL-3

7.460 Security and Outdoor Lighting Service.

Customers to whom this schedule applies shall pay the charges specified herein:

7.4601 Customers To Whom Schedule YL-3 Applies.

Schedule YL-3 shall apply to consumers for dusk to dawn outdoor lighting where service is available under existing line extension policies.

7.4602 <u>Type of Service</u>.

Sixty-cycle, alternating current of such phase and voltage as may be available.

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7.4604 Conditions of Serivce.

The City utility will furnish, install, operate and maintain the complete lighting installation, including wood pole, at a mutually agreeable location. The maintenance, including lamp replacement, will be done on request, during the normal work week, and at no additional charge to the consumer.

The complete lighting installation shall remain the property of the city utility. The consumer will protect the lighting equipment from deliberate damage, and must allow the city utility free access to his property to maintian and inspect the equipment at any time.

7.4605 <u>Connection Fee</u>.

Schedule YL-3 customers shall pay the connection fees specified in section 7.365.

Section 3. The provisions contained herein concern the public welfare and safety and, therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage by the city council and approval by the mayor.
