

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ELECTRICAL RATES AND REGULATIONS AFFECTING SECURITY AND OUTDOOR LIGHTING SERVICE.

THE CITY OF DRAIN ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1.

Sections 7.395 to 7.405 are hereby amended to reflect the change over from Mercury Vapor lamps to Low Pressure Sodium lamps as part of the Cities Energy Conservation plan. Said plan is in cooperation with B.P.A. and in accordance with the guidelines of the Oregon Department of Energy. Section 7.405 establishes the original connection fee.

Sections 7.460 to 7.4606 are hereby amended to re-define the monthly rate for each size of the lamps offered.

Security and Outdoor Lighting Service

7.395 Application and Availability.

(1) All persons desiring dusk to dawn outdoor lighting shall make application for service and by this application agree to pay and abide by the charges, rates, rules and regulations specified in sections 7.310 to 7.470 and of sections 7.900 to 7.910 of this Code.

(2) Should such service require extension of existing city lines, such extension may be granted upon the same terms and conditions specified in section 7.310 of the Code.

7.400 City Responsibility.

(1) Should the city agree to provide security and outdoor lighting, the city shall furnish, install, operate and maintain the complete lighting installation, including wood poles, at a mutually agreeable location and shall maintain the lighting including lamp replacement during the normal work week.

(2). The complete lighting installation shall remain the property of the city.

7.405 Customer Responsibility and Charges.

(1) The customer shall pay a connection fee as follows:

35 watt lamp	\$6.00 per lamp
55 watt lamp	\$7.00 per lamp
90 watt lamp	\$8.00 per lamp
135 watt lamp	\$11.00 per lamp
180 watt lamp	\$14.00 per lamp

(2) The customer shall protect the lighting equipment from deliberate damage and shall allow the city free access to the property to maintain and inspect the equipment at any time.

SCHEDULE YL-3

7.460 Security and Outdoor Lighting Service

Customers to whom this schedule applies shall pay the charges specified herein:

7.4601 Customers To Whom Schedule YL-3 Applies

Schedule YL-3 shall apply to consumers for dusk to dawn outdoor lighting where service is available under existing line extension policies.

7.4603 Rate (Minimum Monthly Charge)

35 watt, low pressure sodium, complete light installation per month per lamp	\$6.00
55 watt, low pressure sodium, complete light installation per month per lamp	\$7.00
90 watt, low pressure sodium, complete light installation per month per lamp	\$8.00
135 watt, low pressure sodium, complete light installation per month per lamp	\$11.00
180 watt, low pressure sodium, complete light installation per month per lamp	\$14.00

7.4604 Conditions of Service

The city utility will furnish, install, operate and maintain the complete lighting installation, including wood pole, at a mutually agreeable location. The maintenance, including lamp replacement, will be done on request, during the normal work week, and at no additional charge to the consumer.

The complete lighting installation shall remain the property of the city utility. The consumer will protect the lighting equipment from deliberate damage, and must allow the city utility free access to his property to maintain and inspect the equipment at any time.

7.4605 Connection Fee

Schedule YL-3 customers shall pay the connection fees specified in section 7.405.

7.4606 Disconnect and Re-connect


Any person wishing to discontinue the security lighting service may do so by notifying the City three days in advance of the effective date of discontinuance.

A \$20.00 fee shall be charged for re-connecting a security lighting service that has been discontinued at the request of the customer or discontinued by the utility for non-payment.

Section 3. The provisions contained herein concern the public welfare and safety and, therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage by the City Council and approval by the Mayor.
