

ORDINANCE NO. 84.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE OVERCROWDING OF THEATRES, CHURCHES, SCHOOL BUILDINGS, AND OTHER PUBLIC GATHERING PLACES, REGULATING SUCH PLACES AND PROVIDING A PENALTY.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DRAIN ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be and is hereby made unlawful for any person or persons having charge of any theatre, church, school building or other building used as a public meeting place, during any meeting, service, show or performance therein to:

1. Place or in any manner maintain any chair, chairs, seat or seats, or other obstruction of any kind in any of the aisles of any such building or buildings.

2. Permit any person or persons other than necessary employees to stand or remain standing in any aisle in, or doorway, hallway or other entrance to any such building or buildings;

3. Permit more persons to enter and remain in any such building than the actual seating capacity thereof and the necessary employees employed in any such building.

Section 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof or upon pleading guilty thereto before the City Recorder, be fined not more than Two Hundred Dollars, or be imprisoned in the City Jail not more than ninety days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
