

ORDINANCE NO. 88.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE CLIMBING UPON, BOARDING OR ENTERING OF RAILROAD CARS AND TRAINS BY PERSONS OTHER THAN RAILROAD EMPLOYEES AND THEIR ASSISTANTS AT ANY PLACE WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF DRAIN, EXCEPT AT A REGULAR DEPOT PLATFORM OF SUCH RAILROAD COMPANY.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DRAIN ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It is hereby declared unlawful for any person other than a railroad employe or his assistant or assistants to climb, enter upon or get on board of any portion of any railroad train or railroad car at any place within the corporate limits of the City of Drain; except that passengers shall be allowed to board passenger cars at a regular depot platform of such railroad company.

Section 2. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof before the City Recorder shall be punished by a fine of not more than Twenty-Five Dollars, or in default thereof by imprisonment in the City Jail one day for each Two Dollars of such fine.
